**SPF** 商品の説明

<u>Script</u>

A: Next, I'm going to apply a sunscreen with SPF20 and PA++.


B: Ok. What's the difference between SPF and PA?

A: SPF stands for Sun Protection Factor. It's the measurement of UVB protection. The SPF number represents the length of time you can stay out in the sun without burning. PA stands for Protection grade of UVA. It's Japanese measurement of UVA protection. The number of "+" represents the strength of protection level.

B: So, what about SPF20? How long can I stay out in the sun without burning?

A: Let's say, you would normally start to burn in 20 min. In that case, SPF20 allows you to stay out in the sun 20 times longer, which is 400 min.
